Entry Criteria

Entrants must fulfil the minimum requirements below:

- Be a Senior Cycle student enrolled in an Irish Post Primary School
- Complete and submit their entry in a MFL
- Have uploaded their entry to <https://euroguidance.ie/competition/form>
on or before the 23rd of October 2020

Selection Process

- On Monday 26th of October 2020 Euroguidance Ireland and Languages Connect will export a list of all entries received as of 23.59 on 23/10/20
- Euroguidance Ireland and Languages Connect will then assess all applications looking at the following:
 - Creativity
 - Use of language
 - Job application skills
 - Adherence to guidelines

Following this assessment, 1 x entrant will then be nominated as winner from all entries

In November 2020 Euroguidance Ireland and Languages Connect will advise the Guidance Counsellor / Teacher in the school of the winning student and arrange for the awarding of prizes.

The Euroguidance Ireland / Languages Connect winning decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into.
