FEE INFORMATION



The majority of Norwegian universities and state university colleges are publicly funded, and the Norwegian government considers access to higher education for all to be an important part of the Norwegian society. Thus, as a rule, Norwegian public institutions do not charge tuition fees. This also applies to international students, no matter which country you come from

APPLICATION PROCESS



Applications and admissions to higher education in Norway for courses taught through English are handled by each institution, and the different institutions may have different requirements and deadlines.

Some study programmes have special admission requirements, usually related to specialist subjects or fields of study from secondary school.

IMPORTANT DATES



It is always best practice to check with the individual institutions regarding their procedures and deadlines.

For the most part- Norwegian universities enroll new students for the autumn semester which begins in the middle of August. The deadline to apply is 15th April, and applicants must meet all requirements before 1st July. This sadly means that those with a Leaving Certificate would be too late to apply for same year enrollment. You'll find more information about this here:

GENERAL ENTRY REQUIREMENTS



The list below contains information about what type of basic education you may need to qualify for admission to universities and university colleges in Norway.

Ireland:

- Leaving Certificate, examination in at least 6 subjects where at least 2 subjects are on Higher Level
- No English test required
