## FEE INFORMATION



Full-time studies (in the Polish language) at the public Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) are free for Polish students and EU/EEA students (ie: Irish). Public HEIs may offer paid part-time programmes at all levels or paid degree programmes delivered in a foreign language.

Studies at state (or public) HEIs are free for EU/EEA students. At non-public HEIs fees are regulated by the given university.

Tuition fees range from €2000 to €6000 per year and depend on the institution and study program. Health science programmes taught through English will cost significantly more.

The Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) in Poland are divided into two main groups: state (public) and private (non-public) institutions including universities, universities of technology, medical universities, universities of Arts etc.

## APPLICATION PROCESS



There is no centralised system. Candidates apply directly to the institution of their choice. It is best to contact the international relations office of the given university well before the course starts in order to find out all the necessary details about the application procedures and other important information.

## IMPORTANT DATES



Application deadlines vary significantly with deadlines mostly in July/ August, depending on the programme selected. It is best to contact the international relations office of the given university well before the course starts in order to find out all the necessary details about the application procedures and other important information.

## GENERAL ENTRY REQUIREMENTS



Admission to first cycle and long-cycle studies is open to holders of certificates confirming positive result of the examination taken at the end of secondary school education. Additional entrance exams may be conducted by HEIs for candidates with foreign certificates, where the grades from the required subjects are not indicated in the certificate. Moreover, entrance exams may be carried out to assess knowledge and / or skills which are not assessed by the maturity exam (e.g. specific aptitudes, artistic skills or physical fitness).
